## ABOUT TARGET MARGIN THEATER

arget Margin Theater was founded in 1991 by Artistic Director David Herskovits. We create aggressively reimagined versions of classic texts and new plays inspired by existing sources, and seek continuously to expand our conception of what can take place in a theater.

Over TMT's 24 year history, the company's artistic and cultural vision has resulted in 40 Mainstage productions including 11 world premieres, 8 company-created works, 3 U.S. premieres and 5 new translations, which have garnered 4 OBIE Awards and

employed over 500 Equity actors and hundreds of other theater artists.

In addition, we are committed to nurturing the creative aspirations of the next generation of theatermakers through the TMT Lab, a series of smaller but fully-realized works led by emerging artists, and the TMT Institute, our yearlong fellowship program. The list of artists who can trace their roots back to TMT is long and growing, including Affiliated Artists Clare Barron, James Tigger! Ferguson, Rinne Groff, Asta Bennie Hostetter, Steven Rattazzi, and David Zinn, to name a few.

# ARTISTIC NOTE

TMT'S 2016 SEASON LAUNCHES OUR EUGENE O'NEILL PROGRAM, which features Mourning Becomes Electra, O'Neill's great trilogy, as its spine. O'Neill is epic, tragic, and experimental; his writing is steeped in his own personal mythology as well as the mythologies of ancient Greece and America and yet at the same time demonstrates his commitment to reaching the widest possible audience. Mourning spans American history, follows the growth of naturalism, and features vivid innovations. Our work with this classic text

will startle and challenge your expectations while still being accessible, entertaining, and fun.

IN FEBRUARY 2016, WE PRESENT DRUNKEN WITH WHAT, the first in a series of intoxicating studies exploring Mourning Becomes Electra, in the Abrons Arts Center's Playhouse. Then, in June 2016 our Lab program at the HERE Arts Center will present a radical new approach to The Iceman Cometh, with four diverse theater artists each tackling a separate act of the mammoth work. We continue with the TMT Institute, helping a new group of theater-makers examine their practice in a year of reflection and experimentation.

We continue in Fall 2016 with a Lab program exploring the lesser known, forgotten, and unfinished works of O'Neill, as well as a collaboration with City University of New York (CUNY) and *DURNED QUEER*—David Herskovits' second pass at the *Mourning* trilogy. Spring 2017 concludes our O'Neill exploration with a 25th Anniversary Gala and an epic marathon production of the entirety of *Mourning Becomes Electra*.



The Institute for Collaborative Theater Making harnesses Target Margin's history of nurturing emerging talent, providing support and space for five diverse artists to challenge themselves and their theater-making practices. It is a place for open-ended questioning and experimentation within, and at, the edges of the form of theater.

With the Institute we uphold TMT's tradition of bold innovation with a new wave of theater makers. Every year five artists are selected as Institute Fellows; they each receive a stipend of \$1,000 as well as additional institutional support, and they meet regularly to discuss, experiment, and rethink their work freely. Past Fellows include Avi Amon, Kaaron Briscoe, Tanisha Christie, Morgan Gould, Claire Moodey, Kyoung Park, Cara Scarmack, Sarah Cameron Sunde, Ari Tabei, and Peter Mills Weiss.

**ELIZA BENT** is a playwright and performer. MacDowell Colony fellow, Bay Area Playwrights Finalist, New Georges affiliated artist. Bent frequently writes for American Theatre and performs with the OBIE award winning company Half Straddle. MFA in playwriting Brooklyn College.

STEPHEN CEDARS is an award-winning writer, director and teacher originally from south Louisiana. He produces and creates new work throughout New York City, and his plays have been produced and developed throughout the country. He earned his MFA in Dramatic Writing from NYU, which he attended as a Goldberg Fellow.
