ABOUT MAGIC IN PLAIN SIGHT

Target Margin Theater presents a new edition of *Magic in Plain Sight* from May 7 to June 19. *Magic in Plain Sight* is comprised of *Now Go and Act Accordingly*, a new work created under the direction of David Herskovits, and a series of one-week artist residencies with showings at their conclusion. The public events are designed for a limited number audience members who safely watch from the sidewalk.
